Good Morning!

Our nephew's wife is a native of Venezuela, and although she speaks English very well, she often makes online posts in Spanish. Facebook will translate the comments but not always accurately. For example, a 2016 translation mentioning something about "doggies," didn't make sense to me. When asked about it later, she burst into laughter because her post was intended to cheer on our family's favorite baseball team, the "Cubs."

A recent survey revealed that nearly twothirds of 16 to 34-year-olds rely on translation apps to assist them when traveling with one-fifth of them indicating they experienced misunderstandings because of mistranslations on their phone. For example, a warning sign reading "Blasting in Progress" was rendered as "Workers Exploding." (Emma Woollacott, The BBC 9-25-18).

Long ago I learned that communication isn't what is said; it's what is heard. Your church may be saying all the right things, but your community may not be hearing what you intend. The gospel message is often misunderstood because something's lost in translation. One of the great miracles of Acts 2 was that many heard the testimony of the early Christians in their own language! It wasn't because they had an app on their phones, but because God supernaturally made it possible.

In Jesus' earthly ministry he spoke the language of the common people, a language that could be understood. Likewise, the New Testament was written in the Greek of the common people, not the Classical Greek. If we have any hope of experiencing Acts 2 results today it will be because God enables us to speak the language of the skeptics, the millennials the "nones," and the "dones." -Doug Shoemaker
