Reports from IYM Affiliates

Quaker Haven: Director, Brandon Dennis, reports that as camp has improved facilities and increased their accessibility over the past few years, their opportunities to love people and provide for their needs jumped from 22,000 to 35,400 camper days. Experiences from these numbers have resulted in commitments to Christ, answering His call to ministry, closer families, and stronger churches. One quote from a camper was, "I was crying because for the first time in my life, I felt wanted and loved." Other news from Quaker Haven is that the two-staff family duplex is under construction, a great structure to house the Brock Sizelove family as well as the Kevin Lipsey family, and for families for years to come.

White's Residential & Family Services: Some stats from White's include 266 youth served x 366 days average length of stay = 97,356 days in care (foster care); 248 students served x 202 days average length of stay = 50,096 days in care (residential students); 36 students served (Compass Rose Academy); and 36 families served (father engagements).

Belize City Friends Center: Pastor Oscar Mmbali shared that the Center organized a Christmas project to better love and serve their community. The project served 176 people. The students discussed lessons learned from this project, such as Jesus Christ as the gift of God to the world, sharing as a way of caring for the least of these, and several other valuable lessons.

Friends Theological College: President Robert Wafula reported about how thankful he is for their accreditation with ACTEA Council. Also, he was inspired by attending ACTEA a theological seminary where this 120 year-old seminary with 1200 students is staying focused as a seminary instead of converting to a university. FTC's new Academic Dean, Rodgers Wekesi, started off "flying." And Nancy Wafula has

joined their faculty due to a high demand from both students and faculty. President Wafula sends his greetings and blessings!
