A recent issue of "The Church Around the World" ran an article excerpted from *Becoming a Welcoming Church* by Thom Rainer (2018). A study of first-time church guests revealed several factors that will make a visitor more likely to return. Three of the top ten factors were related to the existing church members. While most of us probably think we are friendly, guests may see it differently. Introducing yourself to a visitor or even inviting guests to sit with you can help them feel that maybe someone here really cares.

Does your church have greeters? The answer is yes whether appointed or not. The better question is, do your greeters extend a genuine welcome?

Several factors deal with making your facility guest-friendly. More than once I've driven slowly by a church trying to guess where I should park and what door I should enter. Effective signage can remove a lot of apprehensions and may even help a visitor find a restroom without having to awkwardly ask for directions. Having a safe and secure children's area that's fun and inviting is also important.

Another factor that I found interesting was "No forced greeting time." Many of our churches have a greeting time that feels like a mini-family reunion to many of us but feels entirely different to a first-time visitor. One person was quoted as saying, "My wife and I just moved to the area and are visiting churches. If we visit one with that fake stand-and-greet-time, we don't return."

When was the last time you reviewed what your church looks like and feels like to someone who doesn't know the drill? *-Doug Shoemaker*
