If you can't be there physically, we hope you'll hold everyone in your prayers!



Thank you to all who have donated so far, and helped plan this event; it will certainly benefit many people; even beyond those who receive the physical meals.



- ▶ 1 hand towel (no kitchen towels)
- ▶ 1 sturdy washcloth (no dishcloths)
- ▶ 1 adult toothbrush (single pack)
- ▶ 1 bar soap (3-4oz)
- ▶ 1 shampoo (12-19oz)
- ▶ 1 deodorant (2-3oz. Stick, roll-on, or pump)
- ▶ 1 lotion (8-10oz)

Monetary donations for toothpaste and carrying bag (both provided by Midwest Missions), are also needed, in addition to 1-gal plastic zipper bags. Place in a pew envelope marked for "Missions," or by check with MM in the memo line. Donations can be placed in the narthex.
